ENVIROMENTORS®

Since 1994, EnviroMentors® has been the country's leading mobile incursion-based environmental education program, reaching every corner of NSW with sustainability workshops. It is our long-standing, interactive workshop for students aged 4 to 13 attending primary school.

Unlike an assembly style talk, EnviroMentors® offers schools five interactive workshops a day designed for one class at a time. Students and teachers can ask questions relevant to their school and home lives and participate in games and group activities to better consolidate their understanding of sustainability issues.

All our lessons are curriculum linked, and we work with local councils, ROCs and organisations around the State to incorporate local waste services and catchment information into our workshops.



WASTE DISPOSAL & MINIMISATION MODULES



We offer three focussed modules on the issue of waste management, waste reduction, correct bin use and recycling.

IN THE BIN

Analysis of waste items to identify the best waste for common household's items, including kerbside, pick up and drop off services in the LGA. Students learn about the importance of sorting waste correctly, what happens to waste and the waste hierarchy.

RECYCLING

Exploration of recyclable items using domestic services in their LGA, drop of points for tricky recycling and Return and Earn initiatives. Students learn to identity waste as a valuable resource that can be used over to conserve natural resources.

LUNCHES UNWRAPPED

Developing an understanding of how waste is sorted and where it ends up, students identify the best practices in packing lunches, how to avoid waste and which bin is best to use when it cannot be avoided.

CATCHMENT HEALTH & LITTER MODULES



Covering stormwater systems, pollutant and litter travel through local catchments and the environmental consequences.

KEEPING WATERWAYS CLEAN

Positive strategies to prevent stormwater pollution are developed as students learn the difference between sewage and stormwater systems, common pollutants and their environmental implications and a deeper appreciation of the part they play in their local catchment.

LITTER

The environmental and social impacts of littered spaces are investigated, as well as an in-depth understanding of how litter travels – especially through stormwater systems – is developed. Students will understand how interconnected their surrounds are with the far-reaching implications of litter.

ORGANIC WASTE RECYCLING MODULE



COMPOSTING AND WORM FARMING

Focussing on the school's chosen organic recycling system, students identify compostable waste they can add, what to leave out and some of the organisms responsible for decomposition.

Students will understand how to maintain a working compost and/ or worm farm, including common pitfalls and the remedies.

The need to minimise organic waste sent to landfill and methane production is discussed with older students.

RESOURCE CONSERVATION MODULES



SAVING WATER

Students examine the water cycle, just how much potable water we have on earth and in the local area, and how we need to share this limited sully.

Current local water restrictions, dam levels and council information are included.

SUSTAINABILITY

The concept of sustainability is broken down into an easily digestible format, natural resources are explored, and students collaborate to identify actions they can take at home and school to consume less and conserve resources for future generations.



SCHOOL AUDITS



We offer two audit programs for both primary and high schools, focusing on Waste or Litter. Both are designed for a selection of students to participate in the audit itself. Education and discussion on waste services and litter can be incorporated for more classes to participate.

SCHOOL WASTE AUDITS

Designed to guide schools in achieving their goal of diverting and reducing waste going to landfill.

Students will assess the school's waste production by identifying major sources, types of waste being produced and evaluating the school's current recycling and composting programs.

SCHOOL LITTER AUDITS

Reduce the amount of litter in schools and the surrounding community by equipping students with the information required to introduce litter reduction strategies at school, home and in their communities.

Littering hotspots are identified, stormwater systems and management of litter are discussed.



ADULT EDUCATION

TRAIN THE TRAINER - PRESCHOOL EDUCATOR WORKSHOPS

A two-hour, interactive workshop designed for Early Childhood Educators who want to get their centres and students more actively involved in recycling and composting. We cover games and activities that educators can use to sort out waste and go through their local area's waste services and systems. Additionally, we teach how to set up and maintain composting and worm farming systems.

There is opportunity for participants to ask questions of our expert Educators.
