1300 **Tour 1: Stud Tour of Yarraman Park**

> Located 9km from the heart of Scone, Yarraman Park is one of Australia's leading vendors of both yearlings and broodmares. This tour will take you through Yarraman's mineral rich, undulating countryside with its perfect mix of improved and natural pastures. Spend a relaxing afternoon viewing Group 1 winning stallions in their pastures, catch a glimpse of daily operations and see why Scone is Australia's home of the thoroughbred industry.

Tour 2: Scone Heritage Walk

Scone township was originally two separate towns, the private town known as St Aubin's, of which Main Street was the western boundary and the Government Gazetted township west of Main Street, located in that area as it was close to a water source known for many years as the Scone Lagoon (near Scone Sporties Club). Initially the main business area of Scone was mostly west of the railway line. Kelly Street only became the main business area after the railway came to Scone in 1871. The Guided Heritage Walk will take a loop around the central part of Scone starting at the Old Scone Lock Up, now the Scone History Museum in Kingdon Street.

Departs @ 2:30pm from Scone Historical Museum 43-47 Kingdon Street. Walk is 3km in total and should take approximately 60 minutes.

Additional fee of \$10 applies

Self-Guided Activity A - Scone Historical Museum

The Scone & Upper Hunter Historical Society History Museum was established by the Society in 1966 in the Old Scone Lock Up. The focus of the Museum is on the history of British settlement which began in the Scone area in 1825. The collection and exhibits take you back to yesteryear, with many household artifacts and agricultural tools and machinery on display. The cells and exercise yard are a daunting reminder of how law enforcement was metered out well into the twentieth century.

Self-Guided Activity C - Scone Mountain Figtree Creek Track

For those wanting a bit of exercise this trail provides some picturesque views over Scone. Discover this 4.0-km out-and-back trail near Scone, New South Wales. This is a popular trail for hiking, running, and walking, but you can still enjoy some solitude during quieter times of day.

Generally considered a moderately challenging route, it takes an average of 1 h 31 min to complete.
